

Recovery At A Glance– Douglas County Dec. 7, 2020

(As of Dec. 4, 2020, unless otherwise noted)

- The Nov. 30 deadline to apply for FEMA disaster assistance has passed, but help is still available. Applicants should stay in touch with FEMA to keep their recovery on track. Missing or incorrect information could result in delays in receiving assistance.
- Survivors can stay in touch the following ways: Online at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.disasterassistance.gov); Downloading the [FEMA app](#); or calling the FEMA Helpline at **800-621-3362** (TTY: 800-462-7585). Multilingual operators are available 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week.
- While the deadline to apply with FEMA has passed, late applications may be accepted on a case-by case basis.
- 84 individuals and households have been approved for \$564,739 in federal grants through FEMA's Individuals and Households Program.
- \$631,600 in U.S. Small Business Administration low-interest disaster loans have been approved for nine homeowners and renters.

Housing Assistance:

- \$413,927 in grants approved for housing repairs or replacement for 64 homeowners.
- \$150,812 in grants have been approved for personal property, transportation and other disaster-related serious needs for 65 applicants.
- 1,564 home inspections have been issued with 99 percent completed.
