

# Recovery At A Glance– Klamath County Dec. 7, 2020

(As of Dec. 4, 2020, unless otherwise noted)

- The Nov. 30 deadline to apply for FEMA disaster assistance has passed, but help is still available. Applicants should stay in touch with FEMA to keep their recovery on track. Missing or incorrect information could result in delays in receiving assistance.
- Survivors can stay in touch the following ways: Online at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.disasterassistance.gov); Downloading the [FEMA app](#); or calling the FEMA Helpline at **800-621-3362** (TTY: 800-462-7585). Multilingual operators are available 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week.
- While the deadline to apply with FEMA has passed, late applications may be accepted on a case-by case basis.
- 12 individuals and households have been approved for \$85,425 in federal grants through FEMA's Individuals and Households Program.
- \$112,000 in U.S. Small Business Administration low-interest disaster loans have been approved for two homeowners and renters and one business.

## Housing Assistance:

- \$48,152 in grants approved for housing repairs or replacement for eight homeowners.
- \$37,273 in grants have been approved for personal property, transportation and other disaster-related serious needs for 10 applicants.
- 98 home inspections have been issued with 99 percent completed.
